Dear Commissioners:

When are you going to give back what was taken from us in 2014? Surely, some of you must care that you have made our job more hazardous.

We are not asking for something we've never had! It really is a <u>simple</u> issue. Your hirelings destroyed part of our operational security. Our firefighters need to have it returned... or replaced with something better (like a <u>properly designed</u> and <u>competently implemented</u> digital system).

The long list of <u>lost communications capabilities</u> now includes the NSFD analog repeater system which has recently been converted to a digital system. Our <u>primary communications</u> with <u>Central Dispatch</u> is now entirely via the NSFD repeater system.

Why was it necessary to switch operations from the County's "fire west" system to a system owned by our two townships? It was necessary because Pro Comm Inc has failed to maintain the "fire west" system at an acceptable level <u>and</u>, I suspect, Chief Livermore was desperately searching for a way to improve on-scene security for our firefighters.

The NSFD system, on a scrawny 45.7m tower (1) that was installed by NSFD personnel 25 years ago, <u>performs better than the "fire west" system maintained by Pro Comm Inc.</u> What's wrong with that picture?

Granted, via the NSFD repeater, our firefighters now have better communications with Central Dispatch, but

- -- **Now**, our firefighters have no way to communicate <u>directly</u> with firefighters in Mecosta County and Clare County until they are within a couple of miles of a scene;
- -- **Now**, the NSFD no longer has the capability to enable communications with NSFD firefighters through their analog pagers via the NSFD repeater;
- -- **Now**, dispatchers now have a separate frequency and radio (another distraction) which they have to monitor, **constantly**. (To their credit, our County dispatchers have been <u>amazingly tolerant and cooperative</u> during this entire, burdensome fiasco.)

In summary, the loss of the <u>analog</u> capability of the NSFD repeater makes communications regarding **safe approach routes**, **needed resources** and **scene safety** <u>very</u> difficult.

Those of you with a conscience know that what you've allowed to happen is morally wrong. I'm asking you to show some moral fiber by ordering Pro Comm Inc (or a more competent company) to fix the problems created by this fiasco.

Please, please ... do the right thing and give back what you took from us before one of us gets hurt or killed due to the inferior communications system you forced on us. I pray every day that you will act soon enough.
